INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE AT MCNALLY – IB PROGRAM

What is the IB Program?

The International Baccalaureate Program is a two year course of study that positions you well for success at university in Alberta or anywhere in the world. To ensure success, students in grade 10 complete McNally's pre-IB courses before entering into the full program in grades 11 and 12.

Why IB at McNally?

- Full diploma IB students receive early final admission into the University of Alberta faculty of their choice, based on IB predicted grades, in February of their grade 12 year
- Full and partial IB students can receive advanced placement or university credit, dependant on their marks in individual subjects
- McNally is one of the oldest, most well established IB schools in Alberta (started in 1984)
- McNally IB teachers are experienced, award-winning professionals whose skills are respected world-wide

McNally students write the second largest number of IB exams in the district

Prerequisites

Marks of at least 75%(or a B+) in grade 9 core courses plus the motivation and drive to become part of an internationally minded learning community

- ** Students wishing to take IB Visual Arts must register for Art 10.
- *** Students wishing to take IB Music must register in Instrumental Music 10 or get permission from the Music Director.
- **** Students wishing to take IB Theatre Arts must register in Drama 10.
- ***** Students wishing to take IB Dance must register in Dance 15

IB Certificate Requirements

Students who do not wish to take a full diploma program may take a partial program suited to their special interests and work toward a certificate in one or more subjects.

Off Campus Education Program

The Off Campus Programs at McNally include our **Work Experience and Registered Apprenticeship Programs**. The off-campus education program allows students to step outside the high school environment to gain knowledge and skills in the world of work. We recognize that some of the best learning experiences happen outside the classroom and a student having a job allows them to develop acceptable work habits and gain valuable knowledge necessary for making decisions about future careers. While students are working and developing experience they can also be earning credits towards their High School Diploma requirements.

The Work Experience Program

The work experience program focuses on helping students gain an appreciation of the work environment. Students can work or volunteer part-time after school or on weekends at a variety of work sites. They will explore career choices, develop skills working with others and develop valuable employability skills.

Registered Apprenticeship Program (RAP)

The RAP program is designed for students who want to get a head start on a career in the world of trades. Students can choose to work in one of Alberta's 51 trades offered such as being a carpenter, cook, electrician or a plumber. They will receive on-the-job training under a journeyman supervisor, earn credits towards their high school diploma, hours towards their registered certification, and a competitive wage on top of all that. Success Program

The success program is a stand alone program that provides a structured and supportive environment to assist students to achieve success in their first year of High School. This is a transition program that offers a full course schedule with limited enrolment. Students are identified as those who have experienced difficulty with their studies in junior high. This program provides a structured learning environment with varying levels of support dependent upon student need and can lead to a high school diploma recognized by Alberta Education.

At McNally staff are well versed in a variety of intervention strategies to assist students who may be identified as being "at risk". The second part of our success program entails staff intervening monthly with students considered to be at risk. A variety of strategies are employed to assist students identified as being at risk of not completing a regular high school program. Individualized assistance and attendance monitoring is available to students to support their personal (academic and career) goals. This is our Academic Support program and may involve flexible programming and modular based learning.

Academic Centre of Excellence

The ACE program is an intervention program offered to all students who are more than one year behind in reading and/or require remediation in numeracy. The program has been developed locally and is under the direction of a teacher with the support of a teacher assistant. A variety of materials and programs are used, chosen specifically for each student according to areas of need and level of achievement, creating a learning plan unique to each individual.

Community Life Skills Program - CLS Program

The CLS program is a community based program for students with cognitive delays. As the High School years are years of transition, students will develop skills that will prepare them for semi-independent or independent living. The program provides a caring and safe environment where students can maximize their potential.

Interactions Program

The Interactions program is a self-contained program for students diagnosed with varying degrees of autism. The classroom goals focus on communication, social, behaviour and life skills. Involvement and independence within the school, home and community settings are promoted. Respecting and understanding the unique abilities and needs of each student, all activities are geared for students to be successful in a positive, safe and caring learning environment.
